HOW TO REACH

- 1.By Air: The nearest airport to Assam University is Silchar Airport (also known as Kumbhirgram Airport), located approximately 23 kilometers away. From Silchar Airport, you can hire a taxi or take a local bus to reach the university campus. The travel time from the airport to the university is around 45 minutes, depending on traffic conditions.
- 2.By Train: The nearest railway station to Assam University is Silchar Railway Station. Silchar is well-connected to major cities in India through the railway network. From Silchar Railway Station, you can take a taxi or an auto-rickshaw to reach Assam University. The travel time from the railway station to the university is approximately 30-45 minutes, depending on traffic.
- 3. By Road: If you prefer to travel by road, Assam University is located in Dargakona, near Silchar town in the Cachar district of Assam, India. You can reach Silchar by road through National Highway 6 (NH6) or National Highway 37 (NH37), depending on your starting location. Once you reach Silchar, you can hire a taxi, auto-rickshaw, or take a local bus to reach the university campus.
