The credit of the course is 6 and it is mandatory for all the students of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester to attend the study tour without fail. The schedule of the field programme is given in the below table:

**Objective of the course:** To reinforce experiential and contextual learning. Field trip is one of the ways of enhancing classroom learning by making real-world connections. Field tour helps to expose the students to different lifestyles, places, and eras.

**The following schedule would be followed everyday:**

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**Guidelines for the students:**

1. It is mandatory for all the students of 2nd semester to attend the field Survey Methods (Study Tour) course.
2. Students should bring a big water bottle and an umbrella/cap for their use.
3. Every day the attendance will be taken and the students can leave with prior permission from a faculty member /HoD during the field trip.
4. The students should be present in their respective groups (For Group details see the attachment - Annexure – A).
5. Students need to take many field photographs for final report writing and presentation purpose.
6. All the students need to travel only by the university-hired bus and will not allow traveling in their personal vehicles.
7. Students should follow the discipline during study tour. If any misbehaviour/indiscipline is found during the field trip the students will be permanently suspended from the course.
8. All should bring their university identity card and one field diary for making notes.
9. Research Scholars will assist the teachers academically during the field tour as per the student's groups attached.

All the students should collect the information based on the following 7 topics during the field / industrial visit. The final evaluation is also based on the following topics.
