### **About the Workshop:**

### 1. Art of Learning: Eastern vs. Western

Senior Nomenclatural Registrar and Bibliographer, Harvard University Herbaria, U.S.A.



Dr. Kanchi N. Gandhi has been serving as the Senior Nomenclatural Registrar at the Harvard University Herbaria, Cambridge MA, U.S.A. since 1995. He also served at the North Carolina Botanical Garden, University of North Carolina; Dept. of Biology, Texas A&M University; University of Louisiana at Monroe, U.S.A. and The National College and St. Joseph's College in Bangalore, India. He received his Ph.D. in 1989 from the Texas A&M University, U.S.A. on Grass Biosystematics and M.S. in Biology from the University of Louisiana-Monroe in 1984. He graduated from Bangalore University in 1968 with Honours in Botany.

Having tremendous expertise in teaching particularly on plant nomenclature, curation of vascular plant specimens, field studies in tropical, subtropical, and temperate regions, Dr. Gandhi is globally famous for his active role as part of the collaboration between The Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, The Harvard University Herbaria, and the Australian National Herbarium in developing the International Plant Names Index (IPNI), a database of the names and associated bibliographical details of seed plants, ferns, and lycophytes.

Dr. Gandhi serves as the Nomenclature Editor of Harvard Papers in Botany and Flora of North America project: Collaborator of the Index Nominum Genericorum (Plantarum); Member of the Committee for the Vascular Plants. Association for Plant International Taxonomy (IAPT); Associate Editor of the journal Rhodora; Associate Nomenclature Editor of Taxon, an International Journal of Plant Taxonomy, Phylogeny and Evolution; Advisory Editor of Journal of **Economic and Taxonomic Botany (JETB):** Member of Editorial Committee of the journals Rheedea, Korean Journal of Plant Taxonomy and PLEIONE; Faculty of Adult Education Program, Arnold Arboretum of Harvard University: **Taxonomic** and Nomenclatural Collaborator to USDA-PLANTS database; Nomenclatural Consultant and Data Contributor to USDA-GRIN database: Nomenclature Editor, Manual of Vascular Flora of India (Ashoka Trust, India). He served as Vice-President and President of the New England Botanical Club, Inc.

He also acted as Course Director of four Nomenclature Workshops organized by Botanical Survey of India in Kolkata (2013), Pune (2017) and Coimbatore (2019) and by IB-UNICAMP (University of Campinas), Brazil (2018).
