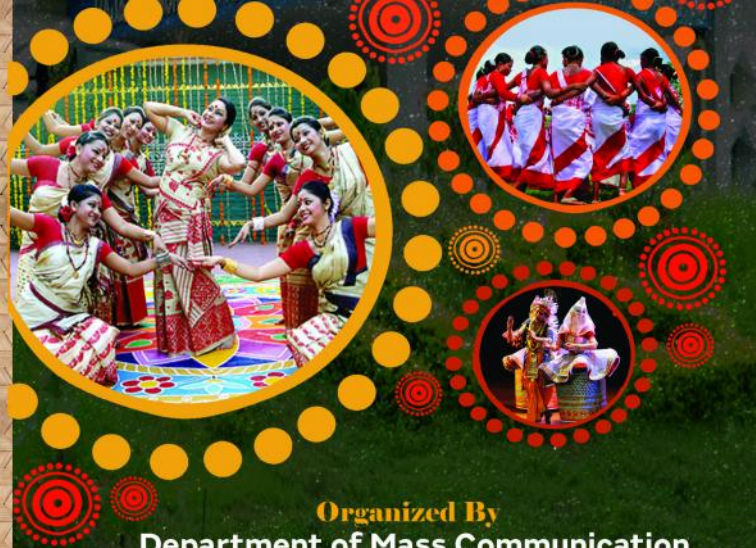

Concept Note

The University:

Assam University came into existence through Assam (Central) University Act, 1989 (Established under an Act of Parliament).
