**Item No. 9: Revision of P.G Syllabus**

The Department has taken a decision to revise its syllabus of MA programme with a view to incorporate new trends within the discipline and also to meet the demand from the NAAC to revise syllabus once in three years. The syllabus was last revised in 2016. Revised draft syllabus was prepared and also made available to NAAC Peer team. Learning Objectives and outcomes have been added to each course in the existing syllabus. Six optional courses have been added keeping in view of the need to make available wide choices to students. Some courses have been revised with updated reading lists.

DAC held on 21-09-2021 had approved the draft syllabus and forwarded the same to BPGS for approval. BPGS Political Science has approved the syllabus on 23-09-2021. The same is recommended to be placed in the School Board.
