About organizers:

The Department of Sanskrit of Assam University started its journey with Master of Arts programme in 1995. The Department offers three optional specializations in the groups of Veda, Darpana and Kavya at the Post Graduate level. Interdisciplinary studies remain the prime focus of the Research work along with the traditional genre. The Department recurrently organizes seminars, workshops and Lecture Programmes. Since its inception, the department has remained engaged in popularizing the Study of Sanskrit language and literature in the region. Simple Sanskrit-speaking courses are regularly organized within and outside the university campus to enable the learners to speak in simple Sanskrit. The Department also organizes Sanskrit Literacy Programme in the rural areas. The thrust area covers Vedic, Aesthetic, Cultural, Philosophical, Scientific and interdisciplinary studies.

Maharshi Sandipani Rashtriya Ved Vidya Pratishthan (MSRVVP), under the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India for the preservation, conservation and development of Vedic Studies by establishing and supporting VedPathshalas. It has around 450 institutes across India where students spend seven years memorising the Vedas as well as studying subjects like Sanskrit, English, Maths and Social Science. MSRVVP also runs the Maharshi SandipaniRashtriya Veda Sanskrit Shiksha Board (MSRVSSB), a national-level school education board which grants the Veda Bhushan (10th) and Veda Vibhushan' (12th) certificates recognised by the AIU and AICTE.

How to reach Silchar: Silchar is well connected with Airways, Rail and Road. Assam university is located approx. 20 km from Silchar town and about 45 km from nearest airport Silchar (Kumbhigram) Air India, Indigo and Flybig airlines have direct connectivity with Kolkata and Guwahati. Delhi, Chennai, Bangalore are also direct connected with layover at Kolkata/Guwahati 2-3 days/week. 25 km from Silchar Railway Station 49 km from Badarpur Railway Junction (Direct trains from Delhi, Trivendrum, Kolkata, Guwahati etc. are available) and 22 km from ISBT Silchar (from Guwahati and Shillong).
