## Concept note of the Workshop

The global Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic has devastated the world of work, causing huge costs on Economies, labour markets, and societies across the world. The threat in response to Covid 19 has propelled long standing discussions about changes in Professional requirements in post Covid world. Due to the abrupt transitions the priorities of career has changed. It is absolutely clear that the post COVID 19 “normal” situation will have to be very different: the institutional and governance structures of the world and national economies must fundamentally change. Corporations and financial markets must not be bailed out. The decline in economic activity has meant reduced corporate profits, declining consumption and increasing unemployment. Many countries including India have responded to the COVID19 crisis by varying degrees of lockdowns, causing losses of jobs and immense socio-economic impacts. Many sectors have nearly stopped operating; others are facing activity peaks with shortages of skilled workers. Some have already re-oriented their production, either to provide much needed masks, for instance, or to produce health equipment. The COVID-19 pandemic and global lockdown represent an unprecedented challenge for different professionals . This impact of confinement is bound to be most severe for young professionals. Young people face a particularly difficult entry into the labour market, which risks having long-term consequences on their careers and earnings. With this background in mind the Department of social work Assam University, Silchar poses to organize three days’ International workshop on “Post Covid Career Talks”.

## Objectives of the Workshop

1. Develop a deeper understanding of dynamics of career in the context of covid 19

2. Build knowledge on developing tools for creation of catchy powerpoint, E-content including generic video, you tube videos, minor editing , screen capturing
3. Highlights the industries where jobs being created under the new threat to human world
4. Highlight and build skills that are needed by young professionals to stay employed in an era of CoronaVirus.
5. To enhance leadership strategies among young professionals to deal with the Crisis.

## Outcome of the Workshop

This webinar will showcase best practices and advice that are informed by lessons learned and recorded from past outbreaks including SARS, MERS, H1N1, H5N1, Zika, and Ebola, and also from other hazards. The webinar will share leadership strategies adopted by the primary, secondary and tertiary sector to continue livelihood opportunities during the lockdown.

## Duration and Methodology
