An emergent DAC meeting was convened in the Office Chambers of HOD CSE on 3/12/2019 to exclusively discuss the issue related to Grand Supplementary, proposed to be held during January 2020 vide AUS Examination Department notice no AUE/G.supple/2019.

The following resolutions were taken unanimously.

1. The members of the department of CSE after threadbare discussion agreed on principle to conduct the Special Supplementary as per the direction vide Notice No-AUE/G.supple/2019.
2. The esteemed members however raised some pressing concerns which are as follows.
 - a) The modalities of the said examination have not been prepared/placed/ approved by any of the statutory bodies such as BUGS, BPGS, School board, AC etc.
 - b) The modalities must explicitly spell, in which manner the examination must be conducted such as finalizing the examination fees (as it is a special examination), maximum number of papers one student can appear. The conduction of Internal exam, Mid Sem Exam and End Semester exam as well as Practical examination.
 - c) As per the prevailing rules, a student must qualify the Internal exam and Mid semester exam in a particular paper to appear in the End semester exam of the corresponding subject End- sem exam. It is however must be clear how much time gap must be maintained between Internal, Mid semester and End semester examinations for a particular subject and also there is the issue of showing answer script to the students.
 - d) The members also consulted the minutes of the meeting held on 04/09/19 where the external member present from NIT Silchar also pressed on the maximum number of papers a student can appear in the special supplementary examination and also external evaluation of the answer script for the said examination which the department members also agreed in principle.
 - e) The members also raised the question about the future of this examination as it is not at all clear, if a student fails to clear any subject. When he / she shall be given another chance to clear the same (with regular students) conduction of another special supple.
3. Further the members also opined that due to postponement of regular examination vide Notification no- AUE / PG / odd / 103 / 2019 the maximum number of examinations were shifted to January 2020. The special supplementary can only be conducted after the completion of regular examination, this again raised another concern for the future of regular students as then their classes shall be greatly affected, as they have to sit in Mid-Sem exam also great number of days shall be consumed in sports week and cultural fest including Tech-fest. Maintaining 90 instruction days as mandated by UGC / AICTE cannot in anyway be possible to maintain.
4. Members also opined that conducting unscheduled examination that too without any approved modalities for the same may also effect greatly in the NAAC accreditation as well as getting AICTE approval of the department of CSE.
