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Concept Note:

India is a land of many religions and our society is woven with the myriad thread of the colors of the different cultures, communities and the ethnic groups. Cultural heterogeneity and multiculturalism are some of the most prominent feature of our society with multiple cultures and countless identities. The cultural diversity is cherished; as some community have become integral and constituent part of the national identity without being merged into a common identity. The press in our country enjoys utmost freedom of expression through constitutional protection and supreme court has described this freedom as the 'ark of covenant of democracy' (AIR 1973 SC 106). Media needs to be positive and supportive in promoting unity in diversity and harmonious relations and friendly understanding among the communities for national integration and development. Recent controversies including regulatory efforts and government interventions in coverage of different incidents have raised the issue of freedom and responsibilities of media and national unity and integration. We have seen divide opinion and therefore it is pertinent to provide a forum for open debate on such issue and find a conclusive line that can be helpful for all societies, media and policy makers.
