## About Assam University

Assam University came into existence in 1994 after enactment of the Assam (Central) University Act 1989. Through its pursuit, Assam University is in the process of making itself an institute of excellence.

Assam University main campus is situated at Dargakona, about 20 kms away from Silchar. The campus is set amid sprawling hillocks and typical landscape of north east. The campus is spread over 600 acres and provide an ideal environment for the researchers, students and the people interested in academic excellence. The other campus of the university is situated at Diphu in the district of Karbi Anglong, Assam.





Role of newspapers in giving freedom to India has been important. Newspapers criticized the policy of the British government through a variety of published literature, due to which new consciousness was awakened in the public mind and public outrage arose against the British Raj with positive thinking and energy. As a result, the British were compelled to leave India. Documents published in newspapers inspire and encourage us even today. From this point of view, I believe that publication of Assam University Newsletter will guide teachers, students and intellectuals. # 19<sup>th</sup> CONVOCATION OF ASSAM UNIVERSITY



The 19<sup>th</sup> Convocation of Assam University was held at the Netaji Mukta Mancha of Assam University during May 5-7, 2022. Over 7000 graduating students were awarded their degrees at the three-day ceremony.

On the first day, Ramon Magsaysay awardee and Stockholm Water Prize Winner, water conservationist Dr. Rajendra Singh, who is also known as the Waterman of India was the chief guest and delivered the convocation address. Congratulating the students, Dr. Singh said, “The true fulfillment of the education acquired in the academic institutions should be focused on the process to inculcate moral values and national spirit among the graduating students who are expected to contribute towards nation-building activities.”

On the first day, as many as 330 Ph.D. degree recipients and 156 Gold Medal winners, M.Phil., and Master’s degree holders were given away their degrees and certificates by Prof. Rajive Mohan Pant, the Vice Chancellor of the University. Also, Swami Atmapriyananda Maharaj, the first Vice Chancellor of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, and also the Maharaj from Belur Math along with renowned physician from Barak Valley, Dr. Kumar Kanti Das were awarded Doctor of Literature and Doctor of Science (*Honoris Causa*) degrees respectively at the convocation in recognition of their immense contribution to their respective fields of work.

After receiving the *Honoris Causa* degree, the veteran physician popularly known as Dr. Laxman Das said that the recognition is dedicated to each person associated

with Sundari Mohan Seva Bhawan hospital in Cachar district. Swami Atmapriyanandiji Maharaj said that the steps taken to build a strong character for building a stronger nation is the pursuit of the Ramakrishna Mission over the past 100 years and this is a recognition of that pursuit.

Former Vice Chancellors of Assam University, Prof. Subhash Chandra Saha, Prof. Tapodhir Bhattacharjee, Prof. Somnath Dasgupta and Prof. Dilip Chandra Nath also attended the three-day convocation proceedings.

Renowned environmentalist and social activist, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri Dr. Anil Prakash Joshi was the chief guest on the second day, and delivered the convocation address. Congratulating the students, Dr. Joshi said, “For a nation to be truly developed and prosperous, one should pay attention not only to the economy but also to its ecology.” He also added that sustainable development is the model that nations should follow and preservation of natural resources, like land, air and water must be paramount in chalking out development master plans by governments and policy makers.

Eminent cancer specialist and Director of Cachar Cancer Hospital and Research Centre Padma Shri Dr. Ravi R. Kannan was the chief guest on the third day, and delivered the convocation address. While congratulating the graduating students, Dr. Kannan said, “Education is a privilege, and not everybody has access to education. Therefore, you should consider yourselves the chosen few and therefore use this education in the service of those who do not have access to it.”

## ECOLOGY & ECONOMY HAS TO CO-EXIST : DR. ANIL PRAKASH JOSHI



Padma Shri and Padma Bhushan Dr. Anil Prakash Joshi noted environmentalist exhorted the youths of Assam and the whole of Northeast India not to leave their land in the professional quest, instead, they must explore the potential of vocal for local making use of the rich natural resources the region is blessed with.

Dr. Joshi said that it is high time, the youth of Assam and Northeast tap the local resources. “People of the Northeastern region are blessed with rich mineral and forest resources, and medicinal plants. But somehow, the resource-based technical inputs, training and market intelligence, and marketing skills could not be properly oriented. The youths must not leave their land; instead, they must tap on the ways to work on local resources which will boost the economy and ecology as well which must grow in tandem,” he maintained.

Dr. Joshi, the founder of the Himalayan Environmental Studies and Conservation Organisation (HESCO), has been the man behind mooted the concept of Gross Environment Product (GEP), especially after the 2013 Uttarakhand deluge. “Today the GEP has to be introduced across the Western and North Eastern Himalayan region to effectively gauge the anthropological pressure on our ecosystem and natural resources like the Gross Domestic Product, to measure where we stand economically, there are four pillars of GEP viz., how much organic soil is covered, how much rainwater we have been able to harvest, quality and quantity of water, air, and forest respectively which are in line with the GDP scale of economic progression. While the GEP will calculate the material value of the wealth of our forests and help to frame policies for the betterment of our wildlife and environment, this will help to formulate policies that boost sustainable development making optimum use of the local resources as well. The Uttarakhand Government had already announced the incorporation of the GEP in its approach and focus on ecosystem and I feel that the Assam Government must also look to implement the GEP,” he said.

Dr. Joshi, in his address to the graduating students at Assam University Silchar admitted that the previous generation, in the last five decades has failed to seriously think and work for forest conservation which is why the future generations have had to suffer. “I do admit and apologize that our generation, since the past five decades is responsible for not being serious about forest conservation. We are losing our forest cover and the future generation is suffering now. Our resource management policy has been largely disappointing. We have been consumers and not contributors to sustain the blessings of Mother Nature. It is an alarming situation when we see that 35 cities, out of the 50 most polluted cities of the world are from India. My heartiest wishes to the graduating students at this prestigious university and I do expect that the students must realize the situation and become worthy citizens of the country and work for protecting the ecology and economy as well,” he said.

## DR. AMBEDKAR CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE (DACE) TO COME UP AT ASSAM UNIVERSITY SILCHAR



Along with the 31 central universities of the country, Assam University will also have Dr. Ambedkar Centre of Excellence (DACE), an initiative of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Government of India. It may be mentioned that the Dr. Ambedkar Centre of Excellence (DACE) was ceremonially launched at the Banaras Hindu University (BHU) in March 2022 by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India in the presence of the Honourable Governor of Uttar Pradesh Anandiben Patel, Prof. Sudhir K Jain, Vice Chancellor BHU, officials from Dr. Ambedkar Foundation, New Delhi and other dignitaries.

Prof. Rajive Mohan Pant, Vice Chancellor of Assam University, along with Dr. P.K. Nath, Registrar, attended the ceremony for the signing of MoUs with Dr. Ambedkar Foundation, New Delhi, informed that the university is among the 31 varsities in the country including three from the North-Eastern states to have the Dr. Ambedkar Centre of Excellence. Also, the university has been provided with Dr. Ambedkar Chair, the Vice Chancellor said.

“It is a great day for Assam University to have been selected for the Dr. Ambedkar Centre of Excellence (DACE). Under this, our mandate will be to work for social equity and uplifting of the weaker section of the society and provide coaching for students coming from the lesser-privileged strata for appearing in the Civil Services and other competitive examinations. We are among the 24 universities to be provided with Dr. Ambedkar Chair. There will be one professor post, one assistant professor post along with two research associates to work exclusively for the socio-economic transformation of the lesser-privileged section of the society,” the Vice Chancellor said.

Moreover, Prof. Rajive Mohan Pant added that a few days ago, the university received the sanction letter and first instalment regarding the center for Indigenous

Knowledge System (IKS) from the AICTE under the Ministry of Education, Government of India. “Barak Valley has got a rich cultural base. Being part of the academic institution, it is our responsibility to disseminate knowledge among the people by bringing to the fore the indigenous knowledge base. Under the IKS at the university, we shall strive to analyze scientifically and document the traditional and time-tested practices of the catchment areas of the region, primarily from across Barak Valley, which is getting lost with time. We shall chalk out the scheme of work for the IKS center after holding a meeting with the stakeholders shortly,” Prof. Rajive Mohan Pant said.

## CENTRE FOR INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEMS (IKS) STARTS FUNCTIONING

By selecting four themes with specific objectives and outcomes, the “*Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems with special reference to North East Studies*” aims to educate and mentor research activities related to Indian Knowledge Systems in the North East India. Except Indian Consciousness Studies, the remaining three themes are directly related to North East India. The inter disciplinary approach, and collaboration is the strength of this center. There are four co-PIs from four different departments to bring their expertise and research to work for this center and also fulfil IKS mission. We also aim to collaborate with other North East universities to promote more project proposals from faculty and research scholars. Publication of books, research papers and articles are the priority. By developing mechanisms to educate and mentor in four different themes from the IKS division, this center fulfils the mandate of promoting inter disciplinary and transdisciplinary research in Indian Knowledge systems. Being placed in the heart of North East India, Assam University would act as a catalyst in promoting Indian Knowledge Systems with special reference to North East India. We bring in the expertise of conducting research for the last two decades, and also the experience of handling major projects.

## NSS CELL OF ASSAM UNIVERSITY HOSTS NATIONAL INTEGRATION CAMP



With over 200 participants and programme officials from as many as 14 states of the country including the North-Eastern states, the seven-day National Integration Camp (NIC) organized under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports Government of India, Regional Directorate of National Service Scheme (NSS) Guwahati began at the Assam University from 26<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

Vice Chancellor of Assam University, Prof. Rajive Mohan Pant, in his presidential address said that it is a wonderful opportunity to host the participants from across 14 states of the country who would take back the great memories of their time spent amidst this wonderful part of the country. "The event brings the scope for cultural exchange to spread the message of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat. People from Gujarat, Karnataka, Rajasthan, and other states who have come to Assam for the first time and witnessed our culture and the locations of Barak Valley, they will take back and spread the messages of our river systems of Barak and

Brahmaputra far and wide. Our people will also learn about the culture and traditions of the other states. The country has given us a lot and the youth, through their deeds must-do for the country as well," the Vice Chancellor said.

Dipak Kumar, Regional Director, NSS Guwahati, in his speech said that the coming together of the participants from across the states here enhances the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat. "The youth need to be self-reliant, independent, and skilled in realizing their civic and national responsibilities. A camp like this adds fillip to the objective of youth engagement for nation-building in a significant way," Kumar maintained.
