Item No. 11: Status of joining of Dr. Sudipta Sarkar in Assam University Diphu Campus:

**EC:158:08-23:11:** In accordance with the decision of the 144<sup>th</sup> meeting of Executive Council of Assam University dtd.26-08-2021 vide Resolution No. EC:144:08-21:06, Dr. Sudipta Sarkar has been asked to report his joining at Assam University, Diphu Campus

in person vide letter No. (1) Letter No. 103/224/2006-Pers/7108-13 Dtd.14<sup>th</sup> Sept.2021, (2) Letter No. 103/224/2006-Pers/134-40 Dtd. 13<sup>th</sup> Jan. 2023. He has also been intimated that further release of salary shall be subject to his joining at Assam University Diphu Campus in person.

The matter has been viewed seriously by the competent authority and accordingly he is once again directed to report to Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Assam University Diphu campus in person within 07 days from the date of issue of letter vide No. 103/224/2006-Pers/........ dtd. 18th July, 2023. But till date no report of his joining at Assam University Diphu Campus is received by this office.

The matter was placed before the Executive Council for perusal and further direction.

Resolution: The Council was briefed about the entire matter since inception of suspension of Dr. Sudipta Sarkar, the order of the Honourable High Court, subsequent orders of the University and the submissions made by Dr. Sudipta Sarkar. The Council noted that the letter vide No. 103/224/2006-Pers/......... was issued on 20th July, 2023. The Council on perusal of the documents noticed that Dr. Sudipto Sarkar didn't report for the duty as asked for by the University. The Council also observed that transfer TA as prayed by Dr. Sarkar is only reimbursable subject to examination by the Finance section on physical reporting to the new place of duty. Therefore, prayer for payment of transfer TA by Dr. Sudipta Sarkar cannot be conceded to at this moment. The Council directed the Registrar to issue a show-cause notice to Dr. Sarkar as to why disciplinary action should not be initiated against him (Dr. Sarkar) for not complying with the office orders on reporting for duty in person in Assam University Diphu Campus. The Council also authorized Vice-Chancellor to take further action as deemed fit on the basis of response/non-response by Dr. Sarkar.

Further, the Council authorized Vice-Chancellor to appoint a fresh Inquiry Officer (IO) for conducting the Inquiry into alleged sexual harassment by Dr. Sarkar. The Council directed to complete the Inquiry at the earliest possible.

The payment of salary of Dr. Sudipta Sarkar upto **June 2021** was also taken note of and the Council reiterated not to issue further salary until further direction by the Council. It was observed by the Council that Dr. Sarkar did not report to duties since February 2019; however, the University released the salary in post COVID situation on humanitarian consideration, based on the request made by Dr. Sarkar.

Item No. 12: Review of suspension of Prof. L. N. Sethi, Dept. of Agricultural Engineering:

EC:158:08-23:12: The detail of the issue was tabled during the meeting for consideration and decision of the Council.

**Resolution:** The detail of the actions taken by the University in respect to suspension of Prof. L. N. Sethi, Dept. of Agricultural Engineering was placed before the members of the Council by the Registrar which was taken note of and ratified by the Council.

Item No. 13: Matter in respect to Case No WP(C)/7077/2019 AUSEWA & Others Vs Union of India & Assam University and Others before the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court:

**EC:158:08-23:13**: A writ petition vide case number WP(C)/7077/2019 was filed before the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court by the Assam University SC/ST Employees Welfare Association (AUSEWA) & Others Vs Union of India & Assam University and Others. The grievances of the petitioners were about a recruitment process initiated vide advertisement dated 06.08.2019, 07.09.2019, and 08.08.2019 concerning 6 (six) nos. of posts. The principal ground of challenge was that the post earmarked for reserved categories have been de-reserved without following the due process/norms.

It is important to mention here that the University had not proceeded with the recruitment for the above-mentioned six posts meant for the academic Departments of Hospitality & Tourism Management, Computer Science, Philosophy, Biotechnology, History, and Electronic & Communication Engineering due to the interim order of the Court.

The University through Shri S.C. Keyal, the Standing Counsel submitted before the Court that the roster had been prepared and would be acted upon. The copies of the roster register were made available in the public domain and necessary documents were also provided to the AUSEWA.

Honorable Mr. Justice. Sanjay Kumar Medhi after hearing the learned counsels of the petitioner and the standing counsel of the University passed an order on 14.06.2023 that there is hardly anything left to be adjudicated in this writ petition and since roster point has been prepared, fresh recruitment may be initiated by following the due process of law. In pursuance to the order of the Hon'ble High Court of Gauhati dated 14.06.2023, the following positions are to be advertised at the earliest since the University has already begun the process of recruitment in the light of directives of the Ministry of Education, Government of India under the mission mode recruitment for all the vacant posts excluding the six positions of the departments cited above.

Item No. 14: Revision of nomenclature of the programme proposed "One year Executive MBA":

EC:158:08-23:14: The Dept. of Business Administration proposed to launch one year Executive MBA programme. The matter was placed in the 90<sup>th</sup> meeting of Academic Council. In the minutes of the 90<sup>th</sup> AC vide resolution No. AC:90:04-22:12 and in the minutes of the 14<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Executive Council vide resolution No. EC:148:04-22:21, it was observed that there was a error in the nomenclature of the programme. In these resolutions it was written as "one year Post Graduate Diploma for Working Executive - PGDBM-WEx." The correct nomenclature of the programme shall be "One year Executive MBA Programme".

The matter was placed before the Council for consideration approval.

**Resolution**: The Council approved the revision of nomenclature of the programme.

Item No. 15: Permission to contest election in Parliament / State / Local bodies by non - teaching employees of Assam University, Silchar:

**EC:158:08-23:15**: Application of a NT employee's of this University for contesting in Panchayat election along with request from the Secretary, AUNTEA to place the matter before the Executive Council is placed for consideration. Relevant documents as submitted shall be placed in the meeting.

The matter was placed before the Council for decision.

**Resolution:** The Council perused the representation of AUNTEA and after detail discussion it was resolved that the University shall take legal opinion on the issue and accordingly communicate the same to concerned Ministry/UGC for consideration.

Item No. 16: Syllabus for Written Examination and Computer Skill/Proficiency Test for Recruitment of Group A and Junior level [Group-B (Gazetted/Non-Gazetted) and C] Posts:

EC:158:08-23:16: The syllabus for written examination for Group A and Junior Level [Group-B (Gazetted /Non-Gazetted) and C] Direct Recruitment of Non-Teaching Ministerial /Secretarial post were approved by the Executive Council vide EC:95:06-14:27.9 and subsequently the Council vide EC:119:05-18:11 enhanced the Computer Skill /Proficiency test marks from 50 to 100 for Group-B (Gazetted /Non-Gazetted) and C in lieu of Personal Interview. The syllabuses for Junior Engineer, Hindi Translator, Ministerial/Secretarial, and Others were also specifically approved vide EC:119:05-18:48 in view of the Employment Notification dated 9.8.2017.

It is proposed that the syllabus approved by the Executive Council vide EC:119:05-18:48 will be applicable for non-teaching posts cited above as a generic one.

The matter was placed before the Council for approval.

The P.G. syllabus/Course Structure of the respective departments as per NEP-2020 guidelines were placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. AC:94:07-23:3 and the Council accepted the same subject to rectification from time to time if required.

The Council added Sl. No. 7 as Master of Social Science to be included in the same item.

Further, the Council recommended the matter to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution :** The Course Structure and Syllabus (PG) as per NEP - 2020 guidelines as recommended by the 94<sup>th</sup> Academic Council was approved. However, Sl. No. 7 of the proposal was corrected as **Master of Social Work** in place of Master of Social Science.

## Item No. 18: Draft syllabus for Certification Course in Bioinformatics (CCBI) for (FOREIGN SUDENTS):

EC:158:08-23:18: Prof. Dipendu Das, Working Chairman, Internationalisation of Higher Education, Assam University has forwarded a Draft syllabus for Certification Course in Bioinformatics (CCBI) for (FOREIGN SUDENTS) was prepared by competent authority of the Bioinformatics and Computational Biology Centre, Assam University, Silchar.

The matter was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. AC:94:07-23:4. The Academic Council accepted the same and recommended to the Executive Council for approval with minor correction in the agenda items as "Draft syllabus for Certificate Course in Bioinformatics (CCBI) for foreign students".

**Resolution**: The Council approved the same.

## Item No. 19: Proposal for mandatory Environmental Education curriculum for all UG Programmes:

EC:158:08-23:19: The Green Mentors proposed for the inclusion of a mandatory environmental education curriculum in all undergraduate programmes under the guidelines of NEP-2020 in the University right from this academic year.

As UGC framed 8 units module syllabus for the Ability Enhancement Compulsory

Course under the Choice-Bases Credit System.

Green Mentors offer a robust curriculum bases on UGCs curriculum framework, which is beyond theoretical knowledge, engaging students in practical activities, fieldwork and community involvement.

The curriculum ensures a holistic learning experience, empowering students to address environmental challenges and contribute to sustainable development.

The matter was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. AC:94:07-23:5.

While going through the agenda the Academic Council was of the opinion that the proposal is as per NEP 2020 and therefore there need not be mention of any third party in the agenda item. Further, the Council resolved that the Dept. of Ecology & Environmental Science shall take the appropriate initiative to address environmental challenges and contribute to sustainable development by adequately developing contents & supporting environmental education, wherever required as per feasibility.

The proposal was accepted by the Council and recommended to the Executive Council

for approval.

All scholars have been re-registered and completed normal two years as per the provision of PhD Ordinance. Moreover, special extension has been granted in the 53<sup>rd</sup> meeting of BRS due to Covid-19 and subsequent lockdown and even thereafter, and require special extension beyond stipulated time of

seven years to complete all formalities and submit the thesis on or before 30th June, 2023 and notification has been issued by Registrar vide no, AURW-13/02R/24/2022, dated. 31.03.2023. But some of them were unable to submit the thesis due to physical issues and some of them faced violent activities of perpetrators in their native state Manipur. Internet was completely shut down which affected the progress of their research work. Therefore, they submitted the applications to the Authority for seeking extra time to submit the thesis. All five applications were placed in the meeting for consideration and decision.

The matter was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. AC:94:07-23:11. The applications received by the University for special extension for submission of Ph.D. thesis were perused by the Academic Council and considering the issues mentioned in the agenda in respect to difficulties faced by the candidates for submission of thesis the Council resolved that the candidates shall be given a final chance for submission of thesis till 31st December 2023 for all such cases which shall not be cited as precedence.

The Academic Council recommended the same to the Executive Council for consideration.

**Resolution:** The Council approved the same as a last opportunity for the candidates and no further extension shall be granted.

## Item No. 25: Relaxation in the eligibility criteria for admission into 1 year Executive MBA Programme:

**EC:158:08-23:25**: The Head, Dept, of Business Administration has submitted the eligibility with relaxed criteria for admission into 1 year Executive MBA Programme in the University as follows for consideration by the Council:

Bachelor Degree in any discipline with at least 55% marks (50% marks for candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL) with minimum 02 years of industrial experience/experience in the fields related to Management. The no. of seats for the programme is 25. Out of these 25, the Department proposes to have 05 seats reserved for Industry sponsored candidates with the minimum qualification of graduates of any discipline and 5 years of Industry Experience. The sponsored candidates will be allowed to get admission in the programme after satisfactory interaction with the Admission Board. In case, Industry sponsored candidates are not available then the seats will be treated as the usual self-financing candidates.

The matter was placed before the 94<sup>th</sup> meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. **AC:94:07-23:12.3.** The academic Council perused the proposal submitted by the Dept. of Business Administration and accepted the same. The Council further recommended the same to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution**: The Council approved the same.

Item No. 26: Registration in multiple courses:

**EC:158:08-23:26**: The Controller of Examination has proposed registration in multiple courses in the University. Proposal are as follows:

From the session 2023-24 registration in multiple courses allowed as per UGC/NEP 2020 guidelines. The process of registration remains unaltered in case of Bachelor Degrees/Master Degrees & Ph.D. programme. However, for registration in courses like Advance Diploma/Diploma/Certificate, the submission of Migration is not required from the session 2023-24. The University will not issue any Migration Certificate for these courses. The candidates who are qualified in Advance Diploma/Diploma/Certificate will not be allowed to attend the Convocation.

The matter was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. AC:94:07-23:13.2.

The Academic Council accepted the same and recommended to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution:** The Council approved the same.

## Item No. 27: Recommendation of Committee constituted for introduction of Supplementary Examinations (i) in all departments (ii) for TSSOT:

#### EC:158:08-23:27:

- (i) The report of the Committee under the Chairmanship of Senior most Professor of the University on introduction of Supplementary Examinations in all departments was submitted and was placed in the meeting for consideration by the Council.
- (ii) The report of the Committee on conducting supplementary examinations for TSSOT was placed in the meeting for discussion and decision of the Council.

The matter was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. AC:94:07-23:15.

- (i) The Academic Council resolved that the Supplementary Examinations cannot be held for all the departments.
- (ii) The matter of supplementary examination in TSSOT was discussed at length and the following resolutions were adopted:
  - a) Supplementary examination in SOT may be held after the declaration of 8th semester result. It will be applicable only for the students of outgoing batch who have backlogs in their previous semesters.
  - b) It will be held once in a year on a regular basis for outgoing batch only including odd and even semester papers.
  - c) There should not be any paper restrictions to appear supplementary examination.
  - d) The paper setting and evaluation of the answer scripts will be carried out by external examiners only.
  - e) The faculty members who will be engaged in the examination related activities may be compensated if the supplementary examination is conducted during vacation period.

The Academic Council accepted the same and recommended to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution:** The Council invited CoE and Dean, TSSOT and heard both of them on the issue. The recommendation of the Committee constituted for introduction of Supplementary Examinations for TSSOT was considered by the Council and it was resolved that 05 (five) papers per student shall be allowed to appear the supplementary examinations.

## Item No. 28: Syllabus of Value Added courses under FYUG programme:

**EC:158:08-23:28 :** Prof. Sajal Nag, Chairman of the Committee constituted for framing course structure and syllabus on Value Added courses for following four FYUG programme which was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. **AC:94:07-23:18** for consideration and approval.

The report of the Committee constituted for framing course structure and syllabus on Value Added courses for above mentioned four FYUG programme was perused by the members and the Academic Council accepted Sl. No. (ii) to (iv) of the programmes where as the Council was of the opinion that for Sl. No. (i), the course needs to be reviewed by the University for which a Committee may be constituted by the Vice Chancellor. The Council recommended the course Sl. No. (ii) (iii) & (iv) to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution:** The recommendation of the 94th Academic Council on Syllabus of Value Added courses under FYUG programme was considered and approved by the Council for Sl. No. (ii) (iii) & (iv), however, for Sl No. (i) i.e, Understanding India, the Council advised that the report of the Committee constituted for the purpose shall be collected at the earliest.

#### Item No. 29: Restructuring of Academic Departments/Schools:

**EC:158:08-23:29**: As per decision of the 18<sup>th</sup> meeting of Standing Committee of Academic Council (SCAC) vide resolution No. **SCAC:18:06-23:1** a Committee was constituted with the Chairmanship of Prof. G. P. Pandey. The Committee has submitted an interim report. The recommendation of the Committee is as follows:

"The Committee is of the opinion that the Dept. of Indian Comparative Literature (ICL) has to be merged in the Dept. of Bengali as there are lesser numbers of teachers for running PG and Ph.D programme in the Dept. New admission of all courses running under the Dept. of ICL shall remain suspended, however, the existing programmes of ICL will run till its completion, for already enrolled students. After merger of ICL, the Dept. of Bengali shall have all the academic and administrative control".

The matter was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. **AC:94:07-23:20.** The matter was discussed in detail and on being heard the respective HODs of the department the Academic Council accepted the recommendation of the Committee for implementation.

The Council recommended the same to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution:** After detail discussion on the issue of restructuring of Academic Departments/Schools it was resolved that the teachers of the Dept. of Indian Comparative Literature (ICL) shall move back to their parent departments and the ongoing Courses of admitted students of Department of ICL shall be run by Department of Bengali. No further admission in Department of ICL shall be given henceforth.

Item No. 30: Regulation on Five Year Integrated Programme (FYIP):

**EC:158:08-23:30**: As per the decision of the 93<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Academic Council, the Committee constituted with Prof. M. Tineshwari Devi as Chairperson has submitted the Regulation on Five Year Integrated Programme (FYIP).

The Regulation as submitted was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. **AC:94:07-23:22.** Detail deliberation was made by Prof. M. Tineshwori Devi as Chairperson of the Committee constituted for the purpose and on being heard the same the Academic Council accepted the Regulation on Five Year Integrated Programme (FYIP) and recommended the same to the Executive Council for approval.

**Resolution**: The Council approved the matter.

Item No. 31: Committee report on formation of Governing Body for the B.Voc Programme w.r.t. Item No. 34 of 93rd meeting of Academic Council:

**EC:158:08-23:31**: The proposal of Nodal Officer, B.Voc on formation of Governing Body for the B.Voc Programme was placed to the Committee constituted for the purpose to re-look the issue and the report as submitted by Prof. S. K. Ghosh as Chairman of the Committee was placed before the 94th meeting (Special) of the Academic Council vide resolution No. **AC:94:07-23:23** for consideration.

The Committee report on the issue was perused by the Academic Council and the formation of "Advisory Committee" for the B.Voc programme instead of "Governing Body" was accepted and recommended to the Executive Council for approval.

Resolution: The Council approved the same.

Item No. 32: Item from the Chair:

EC:158:08-23:32: There was no item from the Chair.

Item No. 33: Any other item with permission from the Chair:

EC:158:08-23:33.1: Revision of Wages to Contractual Doctors of the University:

As per resolution adopted by 155th meeting (Special) of the Executive Council held on 27th February 2023 a Committee has been constituted to finalize the revision of wages of the contractual doctors and the Committee has submitted its report which is placed here for the approval of the Council. The abstract of the report is "Considering the length of service of the concerned doctors (as they are rendering service as per 24 hours duty roster including all other official responsibilities like permanent doctors) the Committee unanimously recommends a sum of Rs. 65,000/- per month (fixed) as honorarium for incumbent doctors subject to approval of the competent authority".

**Resolution:** The Council directed the Registrar to change the nomenclature of the doctors on temporary/part time/adhoc service to Medical Consultants from Casual/Contractual employees with immediate effect and issue notice accordingly. Further, the Council observed that the services of doctors are emergency services and highly essential for the University which is in remote region and catering to a huge number of students, employees and people of the neighboring villages. The Council taking into consideration the holistic picture of the situation was of the view that the wages paid to the temporary doctors needs review and accepted the recommendations of the duly constituted Committee for enhancing the monthly wages to Rs. 65000/-

#### EC:158:08-23:33.2: Grant of Additional Post Allowances:

Dr. Subhadeep Dhar, Finance Officer i/c, and Shri Jayanta Bhattacharjee, Director i/c, CDC have requested to allow additional post allowance to them as per OM No. 2/13/2017-Estt.(Pay.II) dtd. 8<sup>th</sup> August 2018, being discharging the duties and responsibilities of higher post. The representation made by them was placed before the Council for consideration.

**Resolution:** The Council perused the representations made by Dr. Subhadeep Dhar, Finance Officer i/c, and Shri Jayanta Bhattacharjee, Director i/c, CDC in consonance with the office memorandum issued by DoPT dtd. 8<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The members were of the opinion that the officers need to be paid as per the responsibility of the post they shoulder. However, the Council felt that it would be appropriate to take the view of the concerned Ministry i,e MoE before implementing the same.

## EC:158:08-23:33.3 : No Dues Certificate from students/scholar on award of Ph.D. degree :

The University as of now do not obtain No Dues certificate from the students/scholars before award of Ph.D. degree to the respective students/scholars. It is proposed to obtain No Dues certificate from the scholars at the time of submission of thesis.

**Resolution:** The Council approved the same and directed the CoE to develop a standard format for submission of No Dues.

## EC:158:08-23:33.4: Matter related to medical reimbursement to the employees of Assam University:

In view of current trend of expenditure under medical reimbursement towards the employees of the University, the Entitlement Section of Finance apprehend that the same will overshoot the budgeted amount by around Rs. 0.93 corers for the Financial Year 2023-24. The Finance Officer i/c placed the issue before the competent authority to take austerity measures to overcome the situation.

**Resolution :** On the basis of note received from Finance Section, the Registrar appraised the Council that the current approved amount for medical reimbursement is

know

highly insufficient to meet the annual requirement as more than half of the annual amount has been already incurred in first four months of the 2023-24 Financial Year (FY). The Council noted the same and directed the following:

- 1. The University should explore possibilities for medical insurance of the employees and their family members with due approval of the Finance Committee, so that the overall burden on the grant to the University can be lessened.
- 2. If any viable medical insurance cannot be worked out, then the University may reimburse all expenses of OPD treatment as per CGHS rate henceforth after due notification.

#### EC:158:08-23:33.5: Actions detrimental to the interest of Assam University:

It is observed that a number of cases of misconduct by students have been reported in recent past like infighting, ragging, blocking the gate causing disruption in work etc. Further, many of these acts tarnish image of the University or has the potential to tarnish image of the University. These also include circulating of false, fake, unverified reports/information about Assam University. Strict action is desired against anyone who is found to commit such incidences.

**Resolution:** The members of the Council express their disapproval and dissatisfaction on such acts by a few students. After a detailed discussion, the Council directed the Registrar to notify for information of all the students of the University to act as per provisions of code of conduct for students of the University as envisaged in Assam University prospectus and not to indulge in any act of indiscipline or misconduct. Violation of code of conduct or commission of misconduct or any act which is against the interest of the University or which causes disrepute to the University is likely to draw disciplinary action.

Following actions shall attract (i) minimum punishment of being barred from admission to any new programme/course of study in Assam University and future employment in the University; besides (ii) other disciplinary actions; as having good character and antecedent is a must for admission and employment, the University shall not issue 'good character' certificate if the students are found to commit any of these offences:

- 1. Disruption of classroom activities or hindering the learning of other students anywhere in the University.
- Behavior which interferes significantly with the normal operation of the University, disrupts education, challenges the health or safety of staff or students, or causes disfiguration or damage to the property of the University or belongings of staff members or students.
- 3. Possession and/or use of intoxicating materials/illicit drugs on campus.
- 4. Falsification of documents or the supply of false information in order to obtain admission, the possession of weapons.
- Disobeying any instructions of any kind issued by the Vice-Chancellor, Head of the Academic Departments or any authority empowered by the VC to make decisions regarding matters related to students.

- 6. Bringing the University into disrepute by any action/behavior/instigation/abetment with an intention to tarnish the image of the University.
- 7. Failure to maintain appropriate standards of moral conduct, decency and decorum.

It was further resolved that if any outsider is also observed to act against the interest of the University or was found to commit any of the offences as above, then the said person shall also be barred from pursuing any further course in the University, barred from future employment in the University, barred from entry into the University campus and initiation of legal action as per law of the land shall be undertaken.

# EC:158:08-23:33.6: Decision regarding the post of Assistant Professor, Dept. of Political Science, Assam University, Diphu Campus being held by Dr. Sailen Dutta Das:

Dr. Sailen Dutta Das joined Assam University, Diphu Campus on 04-10-2007. On receipt of complaint of Sexual Harassment of a Research Scholar, an inquiry was constituted in the year 2015 and based on the report received from the Committee Dr. Dutta Das was imposed major penalty (the pay of Dr. Dutta Das was reduced by one stage i.e. from AGP Rs. 7000 to AGP Rs. 6000) for a period of three years vide Order No.AUR/DP/SDD-2014/5954 dated 10-03-2015. Against the major penalty imposed by Assam University, Dr. Dutta Das filed a writ petition No. WP(C) 2274/2015 in the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court. In the meantime Dr. Dutta Das applied for ACS (Civil Services Jr. Grade) in the year 2016 and was qualified in the Examination. Dr. Dutta Das intimated about his selection for ACS Jr. Grade service on 26-11-2018 and on 04-01-2019 Dr. Dutta Das applied for lien and release order. The matter was under consideration; in the meantime on 11-01-2019 Dr. Dutta Das submitted an intimation letter intimating that he is leaving for joining ACS Induction Training Programme scheduled to be held from 17-01-2019 & Dr. Dutta Das left the station without any release order/ lien and station leave permission. The matter was informed to the Chairman, APSC vide letter No. AUDC/Asstt.Prof.-1/73/07-15/7220-24 dated 15-02-2019 and Additional Secretary to the Govt. Of Assam vide letter No. AUDC/Asstt.Prof.-1/73/07-15/3253-57 dated 12-03-2015. Dr. Dutta Das again filed a writ petition No. WP(C) No. 1794/2019 before Hon'ble Gauhati High Court requesting for grant of lien and release. Hon'ble High Court ordered to issue a speaking order regarding the claim of the petitioner for issuance of lien certificate. In view of the said court Order Dr. Dutta Das was informed vide letter No. AUDC/Asstt.Prof.-1/73/07-15/5892-98 dated 03-07-2019 that after due consideration of his application, the competent authority could not accede to his request for the following reasons-

- 1. Pending two numbers of cases in the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court vide No. WP(C) 2274/2015 and criminal petition No. 176/2016.
- 2. Major penalty was imposed by the Disciplinary Authority vide memorandum No. AUR/DP-SDD/2014 dated 28-11-2014.
- 3. Action for unauthorised absence from Office still pending.

Date of hearing against writ petition no. WP(C) 2274/2015 is not fixed till date as per the information received from ILC. In the meantime maximum period (3 years) for granting lien is over as Dr. Dutta Das joined ACS induction Training Programme on 17-03-2019. As Dr. Dutta Das has not submitted any application intimating that his present service is not confirmed and in view of the academic interest of Department of Political Science, Assam University, Diphu Campus a decision may be taken by the Executive Council in regard to the course of action.

**Resolution :** The Council perused the detail of the case and advised the Vice Chancellor to communicate the issue appropriately to the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Assam.

EC:158:08-23:33.7: Correction of date of relieve of Dr. Rajesh Seth, Asstt. Professor Dept. of Political Science, AUDC as 15/02/2016 (A.N) instead of 16/02/2016(A.N):

Consequent upon completion of 1(one) year term of EOL granted to Dr. Rajesh Seth w.e.f. 16.02.2016 (F.N) to 15.02.2017(A.N), Dr. Seth tendered technical resignation vide his letter no.
