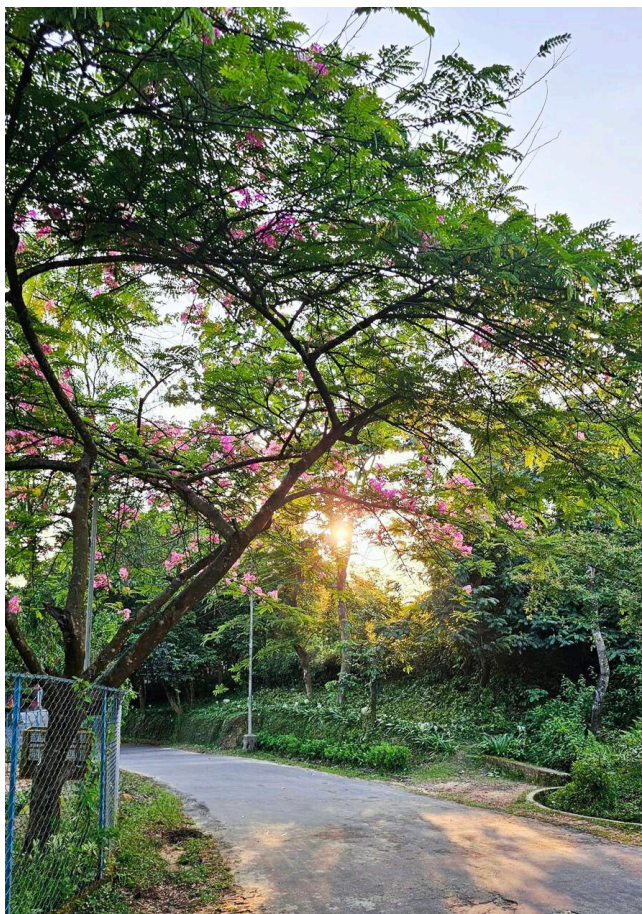

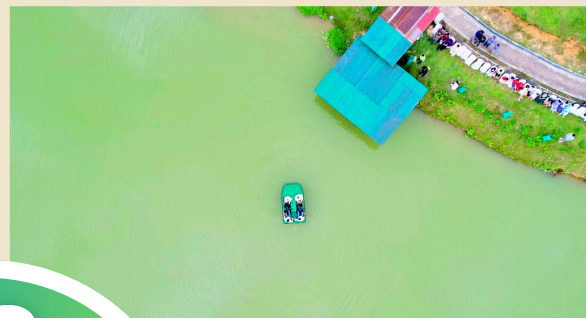

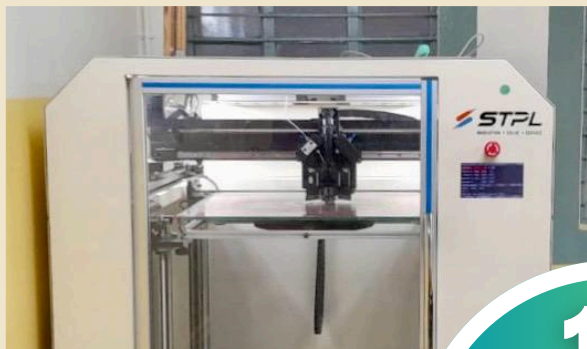

SHAHID MINAR AT THE ENTRANCE OF ASSAM UNIVERSITY

THE LANGUAGE MARTYRS MEMORIAL

The Shahid Minar near the main entrance of Assam University stands as a lasting testimony to the sacrifices of all those illustrious sons and daughter of Barak Valley in southern Assam who laid down their lives during the Language Movement in 1961. The Language Martyrs Memorial is a grand architectural structure with 11 marble columns to serve as a solemn space for remembrance and reflection, honouring those 11 martyrs who lost their lives on 19th May, 1961. It is a major landmark of the University, and all significant occasions and events organised by the University commence with floral tributes paid at the Shahid Minar as a mark of respect and remembrance to the martyrs of 1961.

ARMED FORCES MUSEUM

HONOURING OUR NATION'S BRAVEHEARTS

The Armed Forces Museum at the Assam University Silchar campus was established in November 2022 to foster an interest among the young generation in one of the nation's most crucial institutions, the armed forces of our country. The Armed Forces Museum is the realisation of the vision of the Vice Chancellor Prof. R. M. Pant to bring the glorious past of our military, the sacrifices of our soldiers, and the present capabilities and ongoing modernisation of our defence forces under a single roof. Located about 100 metres across the main entrance of the University, the Armed Forces Museum is arguably a one-of-its-kind facility in the entire North East region housing an impressive collection of military artefacts from all over the country for students, scholars, visitors and tourists interested in learning the glorious history of the Indian Armed Forces.

The Armed Forces Museum is a tribute to the courage, valour and sacrifices of our soldiers and is a unique monument to honour and preserve the rich legacy of the Indian Armed Forces. The museum will provide the visitor with a clear understanding of the customs and cultures of the three wings of the armed forces, the major military operations led by our forces, the humanitarian interventions of our armed forces and the prominent martyrs who made supreme sacrifices for our nation. The museum also has a collection of military insignias and crests of various regiments, scale models of major naval aircraft carriers and fighter jets and transport helicopters. It is truly a space to revisit, relive and reflect on the rich military traditions of the Indian Armed Forces.

JANAJATIYA SANGRAHALAY

TRIBAL HEROES MUSEUM

COMMEMORATING THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF TRIBAL FREEDOM FIGHTERS

The *Janajatiya Sangrahalay* or the Tribal Heroes Museum is a unique initiative by Assam University to preserve and showcase the tribal legacy of India and to pay tribute to the valiant tribal heroes from all across the country and especially from North East India, who fought for the nation's freedom but remained largely unknown in the annals of mainstream history.

The Vice Chancellor of Assam University Prof. R. M. Pant led the initiative to set up the Tribal Heroes Museum at its Silchar campus in 2023 to inspire respect and appreciation for the freedom fighters from the tribal communities who fought for the country's independence from colonial oppressors. Located at the same complex as the Armed Forces Museum near the main entrance of the University, the Tribal Heroes Museum has exhibits of over 60 tribal freedom fighters, including legendary tribal leader and freedom fighter Birsa Munda who led a revolt against the British colonial rule and the feudal system in the late 19th

and early 20th century and Rani Gaidinliu, a prominent spiritual and political leader from North East India who became a freedom fighter just at the tender age of 13 and was in jail for 14 years and was released only after India got independence in 1947.

The stories of courage, resilience, and resistance against oppression are vividly portrayed through photographs, paintings and documents that chronicle the lives and struggles of the tribal freedom fighters through the ages.

The Tribal Heroes Museum serves as an invaluable resource for researchers, students, and the general public alike. It provides a platform for understanding the contributions of the tribal communities to the cultural and social fabric of India.

THE GANDHI MEMORIAL MUSEUM

GANDHI MANDAPAM



Assam University has set up the Gandhi Mandapam or the Gandhi Memorial Museum on 21 January 2023 to remember and honour the life and teachings of Mahatma Gandhi. Located inside the Assam University campus near the old Controller of Examinations office building, about 200 metres from the main entrance of the University, the Gandhi Mandapam, stands as a testament to the life, philosophy, and enduring legacy of Mahatma Gandhi, a figure who profoundly shaped the course of human history.

The Gandhi Mandapam has a rich collection of books written by Mahatma Gandhi, rare photographs, replica of the personal items used by Gandhiji and other interesting memorabilia. The museum also displays Sora paintings, an indigenous art form of Barak Valley besides seeds and pulses, fishing materials, and jute and khadi items. The garden outside the museum has tulsi, neem and tea plants surrounding the perimeter providing the visitor with a tranquil quiet experience.

The Gandhi Mandapam is yet another unique initiative of Assam University to preserve the legacy of Mahatma Gandhi and his philosophy of Ahimsa and 'Satyagraha' during the Indian freedom movement. The museum seeks to educate the public about Gandhiji's life, thoughts, philosophy and his world view through visual arts, photographs, paintings, manuscripts and relics. The museum also serves as a space for the preservation and promotion of local art and craft of Barak Valley.

Open on all weekdays from Monday to Friday from 11 am to 4 pm.



ARYABHATTA VEDH SHALA

THE ASTRONOMICAL OBSERVATORY



The Astronomical Observatory at Assam University Silchar campus, named Aryabhata Vedh Shala, is the centrepiece of the University's outreach and extension activities, and is a major attraction for visitors, and school and college students. Inaugurated on 21 January 2023, during the 30th Foundation Day of Assam University, the astronomical observatory has opened up immense possibilities for students and researchers to explore and experience the mysteries of the planets, stars and galaxies. Located on the terrace of the Department of Physics, the Aryabhata Vedh Shala is equipped with one of the largest telescopes in Northeast India; the 14-inch Cassegrain Reflector (f/10) Celestron telescope with 840x highest useful magnification. The Astronomy Club of the University organises regular sky-gazing camps to observe key celestial events. Plans are also afoot to set up a planetarium at the campus.

The establishment of the astronomical observatory at Assam University is a testament to the visionary leadership of Vice-Chancellor Prof. R. M. Pant, who spearheaded this initiative with a clear objective to provide students and faculty with cutting-edge facilities for astronomical observations and research, and to make astronomy accessible to the wider community and to ignite a passion for science and exploration among the youth of the region.

Public outreach programs and sky-watch camps are regularly organised by the Department of Physics. **Open on all weekdays for visitors.**



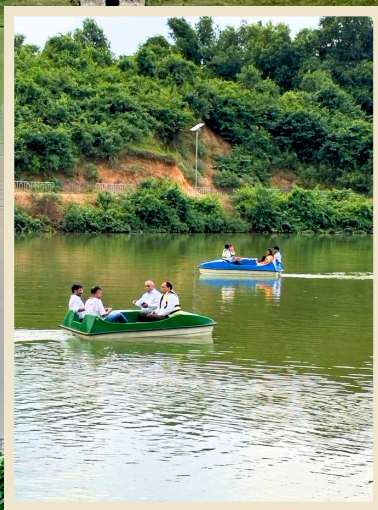
RAINWATER HARVESTING PROJECT

THE SERENITY LAKE

ENJOY BOATING IN THE LAP OF NATURE.

Assam University is committed towards promoting environmental sustainability. The Serenity Lake on the residential complex of the University campus behind the Vice Chancellor's bungalow, and next to the helipad, about 500 metres from the main entrance, is one such initiative taken up by Vice Chancellor Prof. R. M. Pant to transform the water reservoirs into recreational lakes, demonstrating a commitment to both water conservation and community well-being. The development of the 1.62 hectare waterbody into a recreational lake in the last one year has not only set the benchmark on responsible natural resource management, but has also demonstrated Assam University's commitment towards achieving the SDG-2030 targets. With the addition of paddle boats and temporary piers, the Serenity Lake has become a major attraction for visitors as they can enjoy a relaxing time boating in the tranquil lake surrounded by scenic green landscape and clean and fresh air. One can spend quality time by the lakeside reading a book or by simply soaking in the beauty of the brilliant sunsets in the campus. Open on all weekdays.

NAKSHATRA VATIKA

THE CELESTIAL GARDEN



Driven by a deep-seated belief in the inter-connectedness of nature and human well-being, the Vice Chancellor of Assam University Prof. R. M. Pant embarked on a visionary project in 2023: the establishment of a Nakshatra Vatika a celestial forest garden on campus. Nakshatra Vatika is a unique blend of ancient Indian astrology and modern ecological principles aimed to create a vibrant and sustainable green space that would also enhance the green cover in the campus. This ancient Indian system of gardening and forestry based on astrological principles offers a unique framework for achieving several of the United Nations SDG goals.

The Nakshatra Vatika at Assam University stands on a 0.75-acre plot atop a small hillock in the residential complex of the campus. The Nakshatra Vatika is designed to harmonise with the celestial energies by planting specific trees and plants associated with each Nakshatra.

Today, the Nakshatra Vatika forest garden has become a cherished part of the University campus offering valuable insights into ecological principles, traditional knowledge systems, and the interconnectedness of humans and nature. A diverse range of trees, shrubs, and medicinal plants have been carefully selected, each associated with specific Nakshatras (lunar mansions) according to astrological principles. All the plants at the Nakshatra Vatika are tagged with QR-codes with their respective botanical names, common names, Nakshatra association, astrological significance, medicinal uses, care instructions and images. By implementing this system, the visitor experience at the Nakshatra Vatika is enhanced, providing valuable information and fostering a deeper appreciation for these unique plants and their astrological significance.

NAVGRAHA VATIKA : THE WELLNESS & MEDITATION RETREAT

Navgraha Vatika-The Wellness and Meditation Retreat is yet another visionary initiative by Vice Chancellor of Assam University Prof. R. M. Pant in his determined efforts to provide a serene sanctuary that would nurture the mental, physical and spiritual well-being of all students, teachers and non-teaching staff members of the University. This specialised garden will have nine specific plants, each associated with one of the nine celestial bodies-Sun, Moon, Mars, Mercury, Jupiter, Venus, Saturn, Rahu and Ketu.

The Wellness and Meditation Retreat is scheduled to be inaugurated and dedicated to the University on 21 January 2025 on the occasion of the 32nd Foundation Day of Assam University. Developed atop a small hillock in the residential complex in the campus, the Navgraha Vatika offers an idyllic space for yoga and meditation, overlooking the Serenity Lake and offering a spectacular view of the vast

expanse across the northern boundary of the University campus. The central courtyard of the Navgraha Vatika has an embedded structure of the right-facing Swastika, symbolising good fortune, prosperity and well-being. The design philosophy of the Navgraha Vatika combines the principles of astrology, Ayurveda and environmentalism to provide the perfect space for students and teachers to connect with nature, cultivate inner peace and experience a deeper sense of well-being.

The Retreat will serve to offer a range of innovative wellness programs, including yoga, meditation, mindfulness workshops, and Ayurvedic therapies, which will significantly enhance individual well-being, cultivate a healthier campus environment and contribute to a more fulfilling and enriching academic experience.

PROMOTING SUSTAINABILITY AND EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

ORGANIC TEA GARDEN ON CAMPUS

EXPERIENCE THE THRILL OF PLUCKING TEA LEAVES

The establishment of the Assam University Organic Tea Garden at its Silchar campus is inspired by the University's endeavour to transcend the traditional boundaries of academia and offer the students, faculty and staff with a unique opportunity for experiential learning, community building, and promote environmental sustainability. Developed in 2023 over half-an-acre terraced slope behind the Vice Chancellor's bungalow by the lakeside, about 500 metres from the University main entrance, this living laboratory offers a dynamic space where students, faculty, and staff can engage in hands-on agricultural practices, cultivate a deeper understanding of ecological principles, and contribute to a more sustainable campus environment.

The organic tea garden at Assam University is a model for sustainable land management, demonstrating the benefits of biodiversity conservation and responsible resource utilisation. It has also contributed significantly to the University's environmental sustainability goals. Through organic farming practices, the University has minimised the use of harmful pesticides and fertilisers, thereby safeguarding the health of the surrounding ecosystem.

Visitors to Assam University will surely be mesmerised by the visual spectacle of the terraced slope of green foliage on the one side and the Serenity Lake on the other offering a captivating blend of natural beauty and tranquil ambience that the Assam University campus offers.

BAMBOO FOREST

Restoration of Degraded Land in the University Campus through Bamboo Plantation Project

The 600-acre Assam University Silchar campus presents a unique opportunity for ecological enrichment and land resource management. The Bamboo Forest located on the northern boundary of the University campus, was developed during 2007-08 as part of a project undertaken by the Department of Ecology and Environmental Science of Assam University to restore the degraded land and mitigate the risk of soil erosion and landslips in the area. Today, this bamboo plantation has grown into a dense forest providing a vital habitat for diverse flora and fauna and increasing biodiversity within the campus ecosystem, and absorbing substantial amounts of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, thereby contributing to climate change mitigation.

The Bamboo Forest spread over 2 hectares of land has become a favourite eco-tourism spot providing trekking and hiking trails for adventure-seeking students and visitors. The towering culms create a mesmerising canopy, filtering out the sunlight and casting dappled shadows on the forest floor. The rhythmic swaying of the bamboo in the wind creates a soothing soundscape, and mixed with the chirping of the birds and insects, create a tranquil ambience that attract nature lovers, photographers, artists and those seeking respite from the chaos and cacophony of city life. Birdwatching and photography tours can also be organised allowing visitors to capture the unique beauty and serenity of the environment.

THE BIODIVERSITY PARK

A BIODIVERSITY HOTSPOT IN THE CAMPUS

The biodiversity within and around Assam University is significant due to its location in the Barak Valley region, recognised as one of the Indo-Burma Hotspots. This area is characterised by a rich variety of flora and fauna, and presence of various ecosystems that include evergreen forests, agricultural lands and tea plantations.

To protect and preserve the rich biodiversity in the campus, Assam University has established the Biodiversity Park located next to the Apurugiya Uddyan, another park with rare plants and heritage trees. The Biodiversity Park is the outcome of the University's commitment to biodiversity conservation and safeguarding the important wildlife that resides in the campus. The Biodiversity Park features several attractions like flora and fauna diversity, a variety of native plants and animal and bird species. It is an ornithologist's delight, as it is home to several bird species like jungle fowl, rufus-necked laughing thrush, yellow-footed green pigeon, leaf bird spider hunter, swallows, etc. The Biodiversity Park serves as an ideal space for students and researchers interested in biodiversity and conservation.

Assam University has a vibrant culture of invention, innovation, and incubation. In the last few years, the students and teachers of the University have secured over 40 patents for their inventions and intellectual properties (design patents) reflecting the rich culture of research and development that thrives in the campus. The vibrant Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) organises regular faculty development programmes, employability skills training programmes, entrepreneurship awareness programmes, Ideathons and career counselling and skill development programmes. Assam University has a dedicated IPR Cell established to guide faculty and students through the patent filing process, providing legal and technical assistance.

The well-equipped Incubation Centre of Assam University has been set up for innovation and entrepreneurship to enable the students to get firsthand experience in entrepreneurship, promote innovation driven

activities in the University and provide a comprehensive and integrated range of support including mentorship, industry partnership, funding opportunities, training programmes, networking and an array of other benefits. The robust Incubation Centre of Assam University, also explores avenues for seed funding and grant programmes to support promising startups emerging from the Incubation Centre.

Visitors, especially school and college students can witness firsthand the work culture at the Incubation Centre and Innovation Council and interact with the budding student entrepreneurs and faculty members for a comprehensive overview of the startup ecosystem and gain insights into the challenges and rewards of turning innovative ideas into successful business ventures. 3D PRINTING FACILITY

EXPLORE THE FUTURE OF 3D PRINTING TECHNOLOGY



The state-of-the-art 3D Printing Lab at Assam University's Department of Agricultural Engineering serves as a powerful catalyst for innovation, research and entrepreneurship and is set to transform the region's technological landscape by offering training in advanced 3D printing techniques to students and researchers. The 3D Printing Lab has been developed under the Centre for 3D Printing Excellence project, funded through PM-DevINE by the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) and implemented via AMTRON with Industry-Academia Partnership.

The 3D printing technology can expedite prototyping and rapid iteration, enable creation of complex geometries, opening up new research avenues in fields like bioengineering, materials science, and aerospace and thereby preparing students for the future.

Assam University has launched sensitisation drives aimed at introducing students and educators to the transformative potential of 3D printing technology. Targeting schools and colleges across the region, experts provide insights into the technology's capabilities, emphasising its growing importance in industries worldwide and its potential to open new career pathways. Assam University is committed to make cutting-edge technology accessible to students of the region and prepare them for the demands of the global opportunity window.
